Albany Lumber Market.

## In other Stocks .- Nothing doing.

For the ueek ending Wednesday, July 16. The lumber trade for the past week has shown a fair business, but without much activity. The arrivals continue to add to the supply and keep up the assortment, so that at this time dealers can procure all the kinds generally furnished in the market. We notice a scarcity of Sycamore which has advanced one dollar per M. The supply of clear pine is moderate; the demand being sufficient to take it off about as fast as it arrives but the dally receipts keep up the assortment. Of the past week's sales, a considerable portion as low as they will be this season.

Although the receipts of boards and scantling during the past week have been moderate, yet they show an excess over the corresponding week of last year, equal to 2,843,359 feet. Shingles show a falling off of 1,631 M and a large diminution in Staves, equal to 8,929,510 lbs.

The falling off in the receipts of boards and scantling during the first few weeks after the opening the Canal is being fast made up, they now being only 657,970 feet short of last year. Shingles are still deficient 8,219 M, and Staves 18,992,300 lbs. The receipts of timber the past week has made up the deficincy in this article. The annexed table exhibits the prices as estab-


