Affairs in Spain are assuming a very serious complexion. In addition to the advances of the Carlist bands, who are taking advantage of the fact of the Royal troops being snowed up, there comes the Statement that King Amadeus, at last weary of his difficult office, has resolved abdicate. The immediate cause of this action is said to be the result of a disagreement with the Ministry. In November last Den Hidalge was premeted to the Captain-Generalship of the Basque Provinces, which was considered objectionable that the officers of the artillery at once tendered their resignation, and were only induced to remainupon Don Hidalgo retiring. Lately, the Ministry have again promoted this objectionable affair to an important command in Caledonia, and have had their action sustained by a vote f confidence by the Cortes. The Plague of Locusts.

attain a permanent government.

Algeria has reason to complain of a swarm of locusts which recently descended upon Agra, and, covering the surface of the earth, of the trees, and of every particle of vegetation, they commenced their work of destruction, chossing more especially, as their most choice morsel, Like bees, bliss and blessings should the youngest and most delicate leaves of trees, the choicest and most valuable of plants, and, what is more sad than all. devouring the green ears of grain just beginning to ripen. So thick was the cloud of locusts that the sun was completely hidden, and a partial darkness prevailed The natives used all endeavors to dislodge their unwelcome visitors, but failed. They remained during the whole of Saturday night, part of Sunday morning, and then started in a northerly direction. Trees were utterly denuded of leaves, the grass was cropped short, and whole gardens completely destroyed. But in this sublunary sphere it often happens that evils which are the cause of unmitigated suffering to some of God's creatures, causes joy and delight to others. The crows, kites, sparrows and hawks banqueted and feasted in a princely manner during the stay of the locusts, and many of the natives of the city captured them in basket-

fuls, and afterwards feasted on them.
