FACTORY CHILDREN. -The proposition in the New York Legislature to pass an Act for the protection of factory children cannot be practically appreciated in the Western country; but those who have read accounts of the ignorance, poverty, degradation, filth and persecution of young children, the overwork which is put upon them, and the wickedness that is nurtured in hardship in New York and other eastern cities, will not wonder at the proposed legislation. The Act provides that ne child whatever shall be employed in a factory who is under 10 years of age, and no child under 12, unless he knows how to read. The penalty for infringement is \$5 a day. No child under 1 years shall be employed for more than 60 hours in one week, nor on four specified holidays, under penalty of \$10 for each ffence. Nor shall any child between and 16 years old be employed, unless he which shall be proved by a teacher's certificate. The Act also prevides for the registering of minors in the factories, allowing the officers to enter the factories at all times for the purpose of enforcing the
