The Late Brt Lushington and th Byran Case.

English papers by the last mail contain

many particulars of the life of the late Right Hon. Stephen Lushington, the distinguished Judge of the Admiralty Court whose death occurred a few weeks ago. One writer recalls how, after having retired from his judicial office in 1867, at the age of eighty-five years, his name was again prominently brought before the in connection with the Mrs. Stowe-Byron scandal. In the long and embittered controversy that ensued both sides appealed to Mr. Lushington, who was the sole living repository of the secret of gyron's separation from his wife, to appear and testify in their behalf. At a time just prior to the separation of Lord and Lady Byren, the advice of Sir Samuel Romilly, Dr. Baillie, and Mr. Lushington had been asked both by Lady Byron's family and by Lady Byron herself. was in consequence of a letter written by Mr. Lushington in 1830, and Lady Byron's action upon it, that the separation between the ill-mated pair was finally-accomplished. In 1869, at the time of the excitement caused by Mrs. Stowe's statements, it was generally asserted that Mr Lushington alone preserved the clue to the mystery, and it was thought that he would, in order to settle the matter, tell all he knew upon the subject.
