

The miners and engineers of the North of England have just been told by Sir W. Armstrong that the supply of coal is not now equal to the demand, and that economy of fuel is the only way to prevent a disastrous advance in price. The coal miners work only thirty-three hours a week. England uses one hundred million tons of coal a year, and exports ten milhons. The price has advanced twenty shillings per ten during the past year. This is equivalent to an added cost of £110,000,000, an enormous amount when parcelled out among the consumers, many of whom are poor.
