THE PROHIBITORY LIQUOR BILL. Boy Wanted Apply at this Office. . Dr Wheeler. The second reading of Dr. Clarke's New Book Existence and Diety. Bill to prohibit the sale of intexicating quers in this province was called on Monday last, and the constitutional point as to the jurisdiction of the Assembly having been raised, the Speaker decided that the motion was not out of order. The Bill was consequently discharged. Mr. Attorney-General Mowat freely admitted his sympathy with the objects aimed at by the Bill, but as the guardian of the legislation of the House was bound to consider the constitutionality of the measure. He, after careful consideration of the question reluctantly came to the conclusion that it was without the power of the Local Legislature to deal with it, it being a matter over which the Dominion Parliament alone had authority. He dispesed of the argument sought to be drawn from the United States by showing that the analogy was far from complete, the jurisdictions of the several States being much wider than those conferred upon the provinces by the Confederation Act. He was of the opinion that the proposed prohibition of the liquor traffic came within the section of that Act, which gave to thority to regulate matters relating to Trade and Commerce, and consequently pronounced any interference on the part of the Local House as unwarranted and Attorney-General, which either escaped his notice or was thought unnecessary of mention, in view of the cogency of the one he rested his opinion upon. The Confederation Act provides that the Provincial Legislatures shall have the regulation of "Shop, saloon, tavern, auctioneer and other licenses in order to the raising of a revenue for Provincial, local or Municipal purposes."
