A MURDER TRIAL IN IRELAND. Dublin, April 11. - An adjourned assize was opened on the 8th before Justices keogh and Lawson for the trial of Charlotte and Mary Raw, sisters, indicted for the murder of Miss Isabella Kerr and her servant, Jane Tover. The circumstances, as detailed in the evidence, were peculiarly revolting. eight o'clock on Sunday night Miss Kerr was brutally murdered, and on the return of l'over from chapel she also was murdered, and the post-mortem examinations showed that the assailants had used more than ordinary violence in the perpetration of the deeds. British Columbia Excited.

Late advices by mail from Victoria, B. C., report considerable excitement over a rumered intention of the Dominion Government to appoint an Ontario gentleman. who visited British Columbia some time since, to the office of Inspector of Inland Revenue for that Province.
