

The report of the Grand Trunk Railway for the half year ending December, 1872, has been published. Comparing that half-year with the corresponding year of 1871, the gross receipts show an increase of £31,337, or 3.35 per cent. There was an increase in the passenger receipts of £29,953, or 9.19 per cent., and in the freight receipts of £1,349, or 0.22 per cent. The total number of passengers carried was 984,525, against 961,43., and the quantity of freight was 797,935, against 789, 231 tons.
