A Strange Sight at Sea.

Getting into a boat with some of his crew, he pushed out for the mysterious craft. Coming alongside the vessel, he saw through the port-hole a man at table, as though keeping a log-book, frozen to death. The last date in the log-book was 1772, showing that the vessel had been l ifting for thirteen years among the ice. The sailors were found, some frozen among the hammocks, and others in the cabin. For thirteen years this ship had been carrying its burden of corpses - a drifting sepulchre manned by the frozen crew.
