AMERICAN DAIRY INTERESTS. - The centennial committe appointed by the American Dairymen's Association at its recent annual meeting at Rome, N. Y met in Philadelphia on Wednesday evening, for the purpose of devising plans for a full representation of American dairy nterests at the Centennial Exhibition. was decided to erect a butter and cheese factory of the most approved design, to cost no less than \$8,000. It was like wise agreed to appoint agents to visit the various cities and dairy sections to solicit contributions and products for exhibition; also a committee to apportion the expense attending the exhibit among the representatives of the States which intend to participate. There are about two thousand cheese factories in the United States, of which nearly one thousand are in N.Y. State. The annual production of the dairy interests is estimated at three hundred millions of pounds of cheese, and from eight hundred millions to one thousand millions of pounds of butter. Hon. David A.
