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### WAR NEWS,

DEFENCES OF BELGRADE—THE MILITARY  
OUTLOOK.

Ex-Speaker Home left this city on  
Tuesday for home, sick in body but  
well in mind. He is suffering keenly  
from the combined effects of the disap-  
pointment in not receiving the Presi-  
dential nomination, and the unfortunate  
position in which he has been placed by  
the recent investigations. Had he not  
stood up and confessed everything from  
the very start, he would have been  
infinitely better before the country; but  
believing that his letters had all been  
destroyed, he denied ever having had any  
connection in any way, shape or form  
with any speculations or R. Road.  
When Mulligan brought his letters on  
here he was compelled to  
stand up and "with humiliation and  
shame" confess that he had lied. Added  
to this that the Caldwell dispatch, about  
which such fuss was raised at the time,  
was originated in this country, called to  
Caldwell to be sent back to the Com-  
mittee, and that Caldwell's reputation is  
none of the best, it may be confessed,  
that another of our idols has been sadly  
smutted. Everybody admires the bold  
big game that he made, but laying aside all  
political feelings, it is a fact that he  
knowingly and intentionally told a fal-  
shood cannot be denied. An effort has  
been made to get the Committee to post-  
pone all further investigation until next  
season, when it will be able to be pre-  
sent, but without success, further  
than the 10th of July.

An almost absolute feeling of terror  
has been existing throughout this city,  
all week for fear that the Appropriation  
Bills would not be passed in time. This  
feeling can be better understood when it  
is stated that almost the entire population  
of the city is either in the Government  
employ, or in some way dependent  
upon the Government. Orders have al-  
ready been sent to all the Navy Yards in  
the country to close on Friday, but  
fortunately for them the Naval Bill, after  
having been reduced about \$1,500,000 was  
passed. The House is determined not to  
yield an inch on the other bills, and the  
consequence is that they have extended  
the fiscal year ten days, so as to prevent  
any stoppage of the wheels of Govern-  
ment, and hope in this way to recon-  
ciliate their differences. All of the House  
Departments say that if the House bill  
is passed, that it will become necessary to  
pass deficiency bills inside of 6 months.

The Lexington, (Ky.) Gazette tells the

not a hundred miles from Lexington, are
