In the mean-time, while wholesale dairy prices scarcely reach to the figure of eight cents, with car loads upon car leads offered for sale, Toronto people may wonder why they have to pay retail seven teen or eighteen cents for the most ordinary quality of Canadian cheese, and why the present season's make is scarcely to be obtained at all. With all due consideration for our friends the retail grocers, we submit that the current "margin" is entirely too wide. The buyers by retail must expect to pay a reasonable advance on first cost, but doubling the first cost between Ingersoll and Toronto is to much. -- Mail.
