A HOMESTEAD FOR EVERY MAN. Two Little Girls Strangely Joined


(N. F. World of Saturday.)

A pair of twins is now on exhibition at the Aquarium, and is attracting much attention from physicians and others. The two oblidren are girls, and were born co December 28, 1877, at San Beneit, a town about 40 miles north of Montreal, Canada. From their head to the first lumbar vertebre the children are possessed of perfectly formed and entirely distinct members, but below that point the bodies become one. There is not the alightest deformity about any of their organs. They have two distinct sets of ! internal organs and four arms, but only one Frontenac will be held at the abdomen and two legs. Each child controls one set of organs, but only one leg. Piercing one leg with a pin will produce signs of pain Judge's Chambers, Court House, in the face of own child while the other will Judge's Chambers, Court House, in the face of one child, while the other will be perfectly free from any sensation. They do not act in unison. While one laugh's and plays the other sleeps or cries from hunger. Sometimes they both sleep together, and when both are awake they have the greatest desire to play with each other's hands. The features are very regular and the face of each child is very pretty for a baby only seven months old. The limbs are as large as those of an ordinary child. While the two bodies grow into one the bulk is not increased, but gradually decreases into the usual size. They were exhibited to a number of physicians on Saturday, who pronounced the pair to be one of the greatest freaks of nature they had ever seen. They thought the two bodies were merged into one most naturally and believed the children would live to the average age. The children have been named

Rose and Marte. The parents are Sinn and Anne Drouin, who were born in Marseilles, France. Their grandparents are still living there. A few years ago Mr and Mrs Drouin emigrated to San Benoit and engaged in farming. They are both twenty six years old, the husband being four days older than his wife. They have only one other child, a girl who is two years old, and who enjoys the best of health and suffers from no deformity. The father is tall and stout. He weighs 180 pounds, is sax feet high, and has the appearance of a farmer. The mother is short and stout, and husband. Both parents are of dark complexion. They speak no English. One chillooks very much like its mother, while the others bears a striking resemblance of the father. A very neat cradle and canopy covered with blue silk have been constructed at the Aquarium for the twins. Several elaborated silk dresses have also been prepared for them.
