

The Quebec Mercury publishes a communication on the subject of the navigation of the lower St. Lawrence, from Mr Cimon. M. P. He selected Bay St. Paul, on the north shore, about fifty miles from Quebec. as the best harbour on the river, being free from ice below that place. By constructing a railway from Quebec to Bay St. Paul, at a cost of about \$1,000,000, we should have continued intercourse with Europe, via the St. Lawrence, instead of during only seven months of the year as at present. The letter is intended to show the advantages of the north shore over that of the south as winter harbour.


