Sixty Lives Lost.

St. Louis, April 12.—The steamer "Belle," of St. Louis arrived here this morning with 28 survivors of the "Oceanus" disaster, and the bodies of seven who died on the way. The books and papers of the steamer are lest and a complete list of the passengers and crew cannot be given. The names of the passengers are known, several of whom are injured. Eleven of the crew including the first engineer, are known to be saved. The bodies of the clerk Wosham and the steward, Deinerwolf, arrived on on Shore Line this morning in charge of S. B. Fisher, carpenter. It was the middle boiler that exploded, Robert Chew, one of the proprietors of the Atlantic & Pacific circus, saved himself by means of a plank. He thinks Geo.
