

Sir John worked himself into a high strain of indignation. "Only fancy," he exclaims, "when we had a man like him, a great man-a man who, even his oppon nts admitted is one of the greatest men of modern English history -speaking in our behalf to help and sasist us; only think of it, that our newspapers should say that he was a liar and that there was no truth in what he said!" S lat us we have observed, nobody accused Lurd Beaconstield of lying, for that word is applicable only to intentional misstatements. Lord Beaconsfield's critics merely accused him of grocesque ignorance of American affairs, and against this charge nobody can successfully defend him.
