

A Terrible Cyclone.

A special to the St. Louis, Mo., Post from Mobley, Mo., says: A terrible cyclone occurred on Tuesday evening about four o'clock, in the vicinity of Renick, Randolph county. The first appeared in the shape of a dense rolling cloud, filling the air, and making it dark for miles back at night. As the cloud grew in size, the force of the wind redoubled, and threatened havoc wherever it directed its course. The storm lasted but a short time, and did considerable damage. The first to suffer was the barn of Sterling Lend. This building was struck by a wave that literally tore the structure to pieces. There were two horses in the stable at the time, one of which was killed outright, and the other was badly crippled. The dwelling house of Mr. Lend was also injured, and the roof of Bay's Rye torn to pieces. Ryle's entire family were in the house at the time, and every member is some way injured; Mrs. Ryle was hurt by falling timbers, and received wounds that are pronounced fatal. Henry Smith's house received a blow from the cyclone that moved it fifteen feet from its foundation; no one was injured. Fences and grain stacks were blown down, and a well way track, which had been up and carried off a great distance. The root of Henry Martin's house was torn off, and the dwelling of Noah Burkhead was torn into kindling wood, and Mrs. Burkhead injured. The house of Joel Patrick was blown down, and Mrs. Wright, a visitor, (slightly hurt, and has since died.)

Perished in the Flames.

Rochester, N.Y., Dec. 10.—A horrible casualty occurred between five and six o'clock this morning at the first toll-gate on the Lyell road. The toll-keepers house was consumed by fire, and he and one of his children were killed, and another was severely injured. The house was occupied by Mr. Tuttle, and his wife and three children. The family were in bed, but Mrs. Tuttle, her son and baby, were saved with nothing on but their night-clothes. Mrs. Tuttle dropped her children from the upper story into the arms of the neighbours and then leaped out herself. Mr. Tuttle and their little girl, between two and three years old, were unable to escape and perished in the flames. The post office for the Town of Gates was at the toll gate house. All the mail was destroyed. The origin of the fire is a mystery.
