

Table and Herd. Cabul stands on the southern side of the Cabul river, in the midst of a large plain. Rocky ranges of mountains rise on the north and north-west to the south-east, over-throwing it. It has some 60,000 inhabitants of all religions and races. The thoroughfare in the city are intricate and narrow, and are subdivided into lanes and alleys, which are subdivided into sections by walls and gates, and would be a most favourable scene for street fighting were the Afghans at all started. The Balaizer, which from its eminence of 150 feet commands the city, is a fortification a mile and a quarter in circumference, and has walls in some places double and triple, of stone, brick and mud, generally made of mud. There is a large open space in the centre where stands the royal palace and treasury. In the lower part (the Balahair Pah) are about a thousand houses. In 1841 the British occupied the cantonment, a mile and a half to the north, on a site now covered with fields of grain. The road to this point passes from the Kohistan gate and leads towards the mountains. By its side stands the Balaizer, a prominent hill with its base levelled by the late American whose design was to form a huge fortified wall having the Balaizer hills for one side. The line of the buildings parallel with the hill has been completed, and with a mile in length, a series of small rooms built against a high, thick mud wall, having an arched verandah running along the front. It is here that the English troops are quartered. The hill ranges on the north is the Koh Assa Mountain, or Hill of the Great Mother (Nature). The Cabul river passes a gorge formed by these two hills on the west and flows through the city, the walls and towers of defence of this city are situated on the gorge to join to a fortified bridge—the bridge of Jehan Khan. When the river passes out from the eastern side of the city, it flows into the Murgh Khan, which is a small stream, close to the westward are the Balaizer heights, and on the eastern side of the river the Sir Singh heights. The force now concentrated before Cabul is made up as follows: Officers, 102; other ranks, British, 2,500; native, 3,867. This gives a grand total of 6,317 fighting men of all arms. The followers are 6,000; of cavalry charges alone there are 1,500 in the division, and the baggage animals are very numerous.
