The third officer endeavoured again to reach the Borussa, which was fast sinking but was unable to make head against the wind, and he was ultimately compelled to abandon the attempt. MENLO PARK ILLUMINATED WITH EDISON .

INVENTION.

New York, Dec. 24 - The little vil lage of Menlo Park, N.J., was illumin ated with Prof. Edison's electric light on Christmas eve. Only four outdoor lamps were in operation, but electric burners to the number of twenty-eight were distri buted in a dezen houses, and the new light was pronounced a perfect success It was demonstrated by illumination that the light of each so called burner was fully equal to that produced by an ordi nary gas jet in the street lamp or dwel ling house. Only two electric generators were in use to day to supply twentyeight burners, which were in operation, but with additional or more powerful generators, the intensity of the light, Mr. Edison said, could be increased many fold. A third generator will be finished in a day or two, and then a dozen or more additional burners will be set going There was a marked difference between the light of the carbon paper burners at Menlo Park, and the intense dazzing light given by the electric lamps, which have for some time past been used in New York and other cities. The painful scintillation of the latter, caused by innumerable sparks chasing each other -Mr. John B. Gough says in England over the metal, instead of a carbonized retainer, is entirely avoided.
