MB. PARNELL IN NE # YORK - PRNANT LIPE IN IRELAND-GROANING THE "MER-ALD"-IRISH VIEW OF THINGS.

THE IRISH TROUBLES,

Mr. Parnell made a long speech to a large audience in New York the other evening. He dealt principally with Mr. Kavaragh's defence of the land system The following, which is one of his beer points, gives some idea of his method argument. "Well, then, Mr. Kavanagh says, the rents are not made in respecto the improvements made by the ter ants: Now, I wish to put one landlord against another in refuting themselves. I shall choose the estate of a large peasanted landlord, a class who do not as a rule rack-rent their lands, and I shall choose the testimony of a man of Mr. Kavanagh's own class and proclivities, an extensive land agent in Ireland. Mr. Stenart French, speaking of the Barony of Farney-I wish you to recollect, ladies and gentlemen, the preposition that rents are not raised in respect to the improvements of tenants, -speaking in his 'Realities of Irish Life,' page 68, of the Barony of Farney in the County Monaghan, for which he was agent. Mr. French tells us that in the year 1606 this whole barong was rented for the yearly cum of £250. What do you suppres is the rental of that barony to-day ? It is something like £80,000, and the added value from £250 to £80,000 has been the work of the tenants. Nothing that the landlord has done has added one penty to the value of that property. He has toiled not; neither has he spun. Mr. French admits that this was done

by the tenants and not by the landlord. At page 69 Mr. French cays: It was during this period that the native inhabitants, few or none of whom were ever displaced by the aristocratic owners of the soil, increased and multiplied to a vast extent, and that the waste and wild lands were fenced and inclosed, and ultimately brought into cultivation, to meet the wants of the rapidly increasing population; so that in the year 1843, only seventy-four years after the estimated value of the year 1769, I found on my arrival at Carrickmacrobs that the rent-roll of the two estates together amounted to £40,000 per annum, while the inhabitants had increased in such an extraordinary manner that by the census of 1841 the population amounted to something apward of 44,107
