

LANDLORDISM WHAT IS THOUGHT OF IT BY THE AGITATORS -SPERCHES OF DAVITY AND KILLEN.

Immediately after Mr. Killon's release upon bail at Carrick-on-Shannon he and Davitt drove to Dromsna, where a fair was being held. They were loudly cheered, and addressed a large concourse of people. Mr. Davitt said: Mr. Killen has only left prison; and came here with me to thank you for the sympathy you have extended to us during our imprisonment. He also came with me to tell the tenant-farmers that it is necessary for you to assume a new attitude in Ireland in order that you rights may be conceded. Neither Mr. Killen nor myself de-

sire to say anything that would justify the aspersions cast upon our language

and conduct by the Government; but we are come here to preach the same doctrines which we have advanced before, and they are, that the tenant-farmers of Ireland must organize openly and above board, in clubs and associations, in order that landlordism may be thoroughly reformed and totally abolished. (Cheers.) We never have countenanced any violence. We have proclaimed our principles openly before the world, and we intend to proclaim them in the future in the same way We are convinced that we are labouring in the cause of humanity, and thoroughly satisfied that we are working for the best interests. (Cheers.) We are indifferent as regards what action the Government may take. Regarding us personally, they have made a great mistake. The agitation was going on very quietly until either Dublin Castle or the Government in London thought it policy to arrest three or four humble individuals. They believe the people of Ireland will be, frightened, and that the tenant-farmers will be intimidated. They calcuculate that the backbone of the agitation will be broken, but their calculations will prove contrary to their expectations. We have never counselled the tagant farmers to do anything which might put them in the grasp of the law. We are not going to commit any illegal acts, but we are going to ask you to persevere in the agitation until landfordism is entirely abolished. Has the land been conferred upon the landfords of Ireland, for services rendered to Ireland or to humanity ! I say, no. They own land by virtue of conquest and confiscation.
