WILL THE CZAR GO MAD?
HOW TERRIBLE OF ASSASSINATION KILLED
KING FERDINAND II. OF NAPLES.
(Full Mail Gazette.)
To have one's name surrounded by
policemen, and to drive out rapidly and
furtively, enclosed in a close steel-plated
cage, under a heavy escort of
cavalry, may seem to most Englishmen
very annoying. Few in our island can
reasonably be expected to have been
so close an observer of almost identical
of the same circumstances that my recollections
may in this matter be of interest.
I do not speak of Russia, but of the
Sto to whom twenty three years ago
more closely resembled what Russia is
now, so far as smouldering rebellion and
repression go, than perhaps any other
European country. King Ferdinand II.
Naples was a warm admirer and close
imitator of Napoleon III. as well as
his personal friend. In bulk and dignity
of port the Sicilian King was second
only to the Czar. His face bore a very
strong likeness to the portraits of the
Emperor Nero. His rule was personal.
His labour was immense, commencing
in summer at all events, at 4 A.M.;
so complete and zealous was his super-
vision of a kingdom which was regarded
as a personal estate that it used to be
said that Napoleon III. would have
been as ready to resign his Majesty
municipality without the express permis-
sion of the King. In his rule King
Ferdinand was aided, to an extent dif-
ficult for English people to realize, by the
clergy, both regular and secular. Obedi-
ence to the Church was the first re-
quisite to obtain the favour of the King.
In return, the police of the Church was
more subtle and universal than even that
of the monarchs.
On the 28th of December, 1858, I was
present at a grand military review at
Camp di Marzo, near Naples. As the
head of a brilliant staff King Ferdinand
held a review that day of 40,000
of his troops. As the Third Regiment of
Chasseurs a regiment of chasseurs com-
manded by Gen. Nunziante to replace the Swiss
troops as a body guard for the King—was
marching past the Royal station, a private
in the fourth file from the King calling
out "Ora, ora, ora, ora, ora, ora, ora, ora,
across the rank and among the ranks
with a bayonet. In my opinion it was
the heavy and lumbering character of the
saber bayonet alone that saved the King.
He was just grazed, he afterwards told
me, on the left of his abdomen. An
official pushed his horse against the
assassin, who was knocked down and ac-
cused. For the moment the conduct of
the King was admirable. He drove at
once through Naples in a small phaeton,
with a escort of a few men, and he
did not for many months. He then
open his palace to receive all who came
to congratulate him on his escape. His
apartments were crowded, and the King
addressed through a screen speaking to
every one.
I addressed a banquet at the
palace from all the provinces of both
the Sicilies. Then came reaction. In
February following the attack I had
another audience of the King, who was
then in his great palace near
Caserta. I went by a public carriage
miles from the palace my carriage
was surrounded by a patrol of
mounted cavalry. When they learned
who I was they did not search the
carriage, but I detailed a couple of
to accompany it. Before the great
front of the palace stood a line of infantry.
Everything betokened a siege. The
aspect of the King himself was that of
a homed animal. He was all that
I do not know why we should not
"both live for forty years." On the 22nd
of May, 1859, he was dead. Dead, no
doubt, of a disease not unknown to phy-
sicians, but dead, in real truth, by the
charge of the Chamberlain, the

I saw at Naples in 1858-59 must be
