But he offers him nothing in exchange. He takes away the consolation that religion imparts, and leaves you a hopeless wanderer in a Sahara of doubt. He admits that he is all in darkness and doubt, and on the strength of a scriptural fable about an elderly bald headed gentleman, some bad boys, and a couple of bears, asks you to boys, asks cruelty and the Bible as an imposture and a fraud. He says he cannot realize a God who would permit of auffering, and that he would rather die and be anmihilated than sit on the steps of the throne if one soul were suffering eternal torment. Nobody preaches the doctrine of eternal punishment now, and next to nobody believes it. But while Col. Ingersoll is so painfully concerned for the signers in the next world, he does not give himself much concern for the sinners in this, for he goes about making lots of money and having a good time, while the gaols and penitentiaries are full, and men in other lands are starving. If he had soything better than Christianity to offer to hungry souls, there would be some reason in his trying to laugh Christianity out of existence. But he given has nothing. He has not even as much as a straw of hope that a drowning man could clutch at, Life with him seems to be a good joke, and when the play is over that is the end of it. But we question very much it people are going to reliaquish their religion in order to embrace the scurvy idea that they die like the heasts of the field and that is the last of them.
