A NEURO'S ELOQUENCE.

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### TORTY DEFICIT.

HON. MR. ANGLIN ON THE GOVERNMENT FISCAL POLICY.

The late Government properly refused to be responsible for the deficit of the present year, and for the deficit of the first year of his Administration, as claimed by hon. gentlemen opposite, for they had kept within the estimates. But during the first year of the present Government they have exceeded the estimates by at least \$500,000. (Cheers.) During the late Administration the total deficit amounted to \$2,364,540; but if there was deducted the amount spent on the intercolonial Railway, which the hon. Minister would not exceed \$10,000,000 in four months against \$14,000,000 of the preceding eight months in order to make the receipts square with the expenditures. He (Mr. Anglin) trusted, that it would come, but he believed it would. It had been claimed that it had been enjoined upon the majority of the House by the people that henceforth there should be no deficits. Why then had they not over increased taxation in order to prevent a deficit this year? If the expenditure went on at its present rate he would in two years have a deficit of four millions of dollars. But as though not satisfied with the present rate of expenditures, the hon. gentleman had increased the estimates for the next year \$1,500,000, in order to make up deficiencies of the hon. gentleman estimated large receipts from the duties on the duties on the duties, but not understanding that the receipts from the duties imposed on coal and flour alone exceeded the hon. gentleman's estimates to the extent of \$300,000 or \$400,000, his receipts were far below his expenditures. He believed that the hon. gentleman had been taxed to the extent of \$7,000,000 or \$8,000,000 that money had not unfortunately, all gone into the Dominion Treasury, but into the pockets of those for whose interests the tariff had been increased.

### How Wood Pulp is Made.

So much is said about the paper pulp which is extensively used in the manufacture of paper that a brief description of the process of making it will be interesting. Any white soft wood may be used. The bark is stripped off, and the inside and decayed parts cut out. It is then put into a large cauldron and boiled, which extracts all the glutinous matter and rosin and renders it soft. It is then put on a large stone grinder, with water pouring on it all the time. The grinder wears of the fibres until they are finer than seaweed, which float away into a receptacle. The water is drained off by means of a fine sieve, leaving the pulp, which consists of fine fibres of splinters of wood. It is white, and requires no bleaching, but is ready to be mixed with rag pulp or anything else that has a strong fibre and receive the proper composition to make it into pulp, after which it is run off into sheets. The process by which wood pulp is made is purely mechanical. It can be made cheap, say at about one cent a pound. This is the new industry spoken of for Kingston.
