GIANT POWDER

PARTICULARS OF THE TERRIBLY PATAL BX PLOSION ATSAN FRANCISCO -TWO CA-NADIANS AMONG THE KILLED.

(Witness.) Five thousand pounds of giant power der exploded at Berkeley Cal., on Friday the careless blow of a workman putting a cover on a box, and 25 human beings were torn into minute fragments. The works were employed to manufacture cartridges for use in mining localities. l'wenty or thirty men were employed during the day in making and packing cartridges in boxes, and it is customary to have all the packages secured at night

-the men leaving off work at six. The cartridgess are about three-quarters of an inch in diameter and from five to six inches in length, and one has sufficient power to blow up a small-sized building. The boxes are made secure by screwing down the covers, as any hammering or sudden jar'is hable to cause an explosion. The belief is that one of the workingmen in the factory had used a hammer in driving in screws to one of the box covers, and so caused the explo-

aiou which rent the building to atoms. The people employed in the manufactory were buth Chinese and whitee. Twelve Chinamen are missing and an equal number of white men.

The effects of the explosion were inde-

scribable. Five thousand pounds of giant powder exploded instantly, hurling the victims piecemeal into the bay and on the ground in the vicinity, here a leg and there an hand. In one place would be found a human foot, and in another place a skull. An arm was found a quarter of a mile from the scene. The pigtail of one of the Chinamen, with a piece of the scalp, was found lodged in a tree 300 yards away. Heavy timbers, butted strongly together, were splintered into shreds and scattered over the ground for acres in extent, while the waters in the bay between Fleming's Point and Sheep Island, two miles distant, were covered with the debris Large trees in the vicinity were twisted and thrown down like reeds before a tierce gale. The houses near the said works, a quarter of a mile distant, were partially wrecked, the windows and sashes being broken by the concussion. At Berkeley, three miles distant, the windows were broken and bottles on the shelves thrown down. The ground on which the building stood is torn up as if a hundred ten-inch shells fired from a columbian had struck it. No piece of the building remains much larger than a lath. Coroner Hamilton went out to the scene about 8 o'clock and found it impossible at that late hour to gather up any more of the fragments of humanity. I wo boxes of human remains were gath. ered up by the attaches of the Powder Company before dark. There is no doubt that the larger portion of the fragments were hurled into the bay, and will become food for tishes. About 6,000
