Everything is taxed; every fruit tree, so none now are planted, every cow or horse, etc.; every vegetable sold out of a private gar-Every eighth egg is not taxed but taken by the Government. Nothing like a small farm-house is to be found far or near. If there were, the owner is liable to have soldiers or revenue officers quartered upon him, to be brarded and lodged at his expense. The towns are filthy in the extreme.
