CITY COUNCIL. A NOTE FOR DOMINION DAY—TAXATION IN VARIOUS PLACES—THE SCHOOL GRANT WILL ARISE—THE CITY ASSESSMENT.

The regular meeting of the City Council was held last evening. There were present Mayor Carson, Ald. Allen, Dupuis, Peck, J. P. Gildersleeve, Gaskin, Hart, Irving, Law, Maloney, McMahon, McGuire, McIntyre, McMahon, McRae, Pense, Snook and Wilson.

A COMMUNICATION was read from Mr. W. M. Drennon, Secretary of the Citizens' Committee, asking for a grant of \$500 towards a Dominion Day celebration...

Ald. Pense, seconded by Ald. McIntyre, moved that \$200 be granted for celebration purposes, the Finance Committee to distribute. By the minutes he perceived that this was the minimum amount which was voted upon by the Council two years ago...

Ald. Gildersleeve—Have you no confidence in the Finance Committee? Ald. Pense said he mentioned that the Finance Committee should have the distribution of the grant knowing that Ald. McCammon had conscientious scruples about a portion of the celebration program.

Ald. McIntyre promised Ald. McCammon his assistance in raising the expenditure of money for certain purposes. Ald. McGuire—Let the Back Tax Committee deal with the grant.

THE petition of R. V. Mathews, in reference to back taxes—Referred to the appropriate committee. The petition of W. Hartley, asked for permission to sell upon the public market a medicine made from herbs and roots...

Ald. Pense said he would like to know if it was right to compel citizens to pay 25c per pair for fish which they should obtain for 10c. Ald. Hartly—You cannot compel a man to do anything that he does not like.

THE petition of Mrs. K. B. Rathbun & Co. to the effect that the petitioners were considering the advisability of erecting a planing mill and saw factory on the property at present occupied by them...

Ald. Pense said the Finance Committee could recommend no action to the Council until a sub-committee had reported a scheme by which the exemption might be secured for a limited period of time...

Ald. Pense said that he would like to see a list of the names of the persons who had been selected for the duty of driving men into any particular place to do business. Ald. Pense would like to know if it was right to compel citizens to pay 25c per pair for fish which they should obtain for 10c.

Ald. Gaskin admitted that there had been some difficulty about the horse, but that it had been settled by the Chairman of the Fire, Water and Gas Committee and himself. Now when there was this waiting of the required horse by the streets, he was kept in the stables. He did not think that this was the intention of the resolution...

Ald. Pense remarked that it was the intention of the Finance Committee to increase the amount of the school grant by a new school, but did not think the city could afford it. Ald.
