Co's wharf for Hamilton. The steamer Hastings had an excursion yesterday from Belleville to Alexandria Bay. The schooner Gearing is undergoing repairs at the ship-yard in order to class higher. The schr. A. G. Ryan is loading 250 tons of iron ore for Charlotte at 40 cts per ton. The schr. E. G. Benedict is undergoing repairs. She has not been chartered as yet. The schr. B. W. Folger came in this morning from Charlotte. She will sail to-day telegraph poles. There are five steamers and fourteen barges engaged in the iron ore trade of the Rideau Canal from Ottawa. An effort is being made to find the wreck of the ill-fated Northman, which sank in the Spring near Port Credit. A new propeller has been launched as Hamilton, to ply between Port Dalhousie and Ogdenburg, touching at Kingston. The owners of the schr. Anna Foster have made a contract for carrying 200,000 feet of lumber to Oswego at 80 cts per M. Notwithstanding the growing of the Yankees in regard to the Canadian wrecking laws Congress took no action in the matter. Called at Swift's Steamers Algerian, Hamilton; Paris, St. Catharines, Cornish, Montreal; Armenia, Toronto; Cuba, Ogdenburg. The prop. California from Chicago, 3,500 bush. wheat, and Lake Ontario, Toledo, 4,000 bush. wheat, lightened to-day and proceeded to Montreal. The Belleville fleet have been invited to participate in the Kingston regatta, but owners object to starting from anchor as is usually done at Kingston. The following schooners from Kingston passed through the Canal yesterday bound up: Tecumseh, H. Dudley, for Chicago; White Oak, Cleveland, R. Morwood, Fairport; Augusta, Goldhunter, Toledo. The schr. E. P. Ban passed down for Kingston with wheat from Detroit. The Detroit of the schooner Hyderabad were in Onondago lately trying to make a settlement with Mr. Bewick, owner of the steamship Alpena, which towed the Hyderabad to Milwaukee. The owner of the schooner offered \$2,000 which was not accepted. Mr. Bewick asking \$5,000. It is probable the court will settle the matter. The Hyderabad and her cargo have been labeled for \$20,000. Personal. Rev. George Graffley, of Oswego, is visiting his friends and former parishioners in this city. The Bishop of Ontario passed through Belleville yesterday on route to Madoc on Diocesan business.
