

The key that had been found in the prisoner's pocket was tried, and it opened the lock quite easily. That certainly looked very bad for the prisoner. But he said the key belonged to another lock, and he told where the other lock was. 'It was sent for and brought to court, and the key tried again. It opened the second lock as easily as the first. A closer examination was then made, and it was found that the locks and keys were numbered. The number of the prisoner's key and the lock he had sent for were found to correspond. A different number was on the lock belonging to the truckman. It was perfectly clear, therefore, that the prisoner had been wrongly accused. It was also quite clear that he came within an ace of being a victim of circumstantial evidence.
