

THE HACKETT MONUMENT.

THE APPEARANCE OF THE DECEASED-PRINCIPLES OF OR ANGEMEN -SPEECH

OF MR. D. GRANT. Yesterday the Hackett re-burial took place in Montreal. The Wifnest do-

scribes the ceremonies, and gives the following description of the body and the County Master's speech:

"The head was encircled by clusters of dark wavy hair and was turned to one side, the flesh had fallen away from the face, and the skin was dark and the aye closed - not so far gone in corruption as one would expect a body that had been entombed for three years. The flowers and wreaths that had been placed upon the coffin had been far more withered than the body appeared. A few moing the body, and then the lid was closed Six Orangemen then raised the body and conveyed it slowly to the grave, followed by the milent mourners, whose looks plainly betokened their feelings of sadness. their presence, and to hope that no such occasion would ever call them together The coffin having been covered, the grave was quickly sodded, and a bunch of orange lilies was placed at a point on the grave over the breast of the deceased.

Mr. Grant performed the ceremonial eading with three taps upon the stone. tie then addressed the brethren, recapitulating the events of July 12th, 1877. of the death of Hackett, and his funeral on the 16th of the same month. The Orangemen had given up their right to a procession on that occasion and were promised that not a single word of dissention would take place on that day.
