ANOTHER FIRE!—House Burned in Williamsville. Last evening about 7:40 o'clock the alarm was sounded from box 8, the uppermost on Princess street, and a great crowd made its way to Williamsville, attracted by a big blaze. The house of Capt. Cochrane, on Durham street, immediately in rear of the residence of R. M. Rote, had caught from the interior and was utterly at the mercy of the flames. The Chatham engine was very soon under way, and arrived at the scene early enough to do considerable good had there been a water supply in that distant suburb. The fire, under the circumstances, had to be permitted to burn itself out, the "hooks" alone being put in service, to tear down adjoining sheds to prevent a spreading of the flames to Mr. Watty Lamb's and other dwelling houses. The former place was greatly in danger even then, as the wind blew the sparks and flames almost directly over it. The furniture was removed to a heavy loss in breakage, and the family driven to a bitterly cold, blistering night into the street. Captain and Mrs. Cochrane were not at home when the fire occurred and were spared a cold "dip," though they lost a large part of their furniture, with only an insurance of \$300 upon it all. The house was insured for \$500, and a loss will occur upon it.
