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House of Commons. WEDNESDAY. Bills respectively establishing a Court of Maritime Jurisdiction and amending the Insolvency Law were read a second time at the afternoon sitting of the House.

After recess Mr. Fleming took the floor and re-opened the pending debate. He showed in reference to the deficit, under Sir John Macdonald's former Administration, the absurdity of charging the present state of affairs to a Reform Ministry. He defended the new duty on petroleum on economical grounds, and refuted the allegations that the additional duty on malt would be injurious to the farmers, and that it would be a protectionist feature of the Opposition leader's amendment.

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EUROPEAN. THE UNIVERSITY RACE. American Securities in Suspicion. Surrender of Sioux Indians. Action of the South. Chicago, March 15.—Gen. Sheridan has received the report of the surrender on Feb. 23rd of 230 Sioux. Red Horse, the chief of the band, saying the soldiers were the bravest men they ever met. No prisoners were taken, but all captured were massacred. The Indians lost 130 killed and 160 wounded.
