Shipping Coal.

Mr. Dixon, in a letter to Toronto on inter-Provincial trade, claims that the increased distance by water does not increase the cost of transit, as by rail, and that coal from Nova Scotia can be more laid down at Hamilton than at Kingston, and a very little more than at Montreal. All depends on the return cargo and the balance of freights in cheap water carriage. He says that Cuba and the British West Indies export English coal for three hundred miles, while the American coal is near and cheap. Callao, Melbourne and San Francisco import English coal from twelve to fourteen thousand miles, while Australia has some of the finest coal fields in the world, and there are coal mines along the Pacific coast. Kingston imports a third of its gas coal from England, while the American coals are near freight from Montreal to Kingston, and a few miles more to the Atlantic coast. He indicates that Ontario should help to stimulate the inter-Provincial trade by a duty of fifty cents, which will be sufficient, and tend to make the St. Lawrence the highway for the Atlantic shipment of Western coals. He shows how the Atlantic freight from Sydney are thirty per cent. less than from Montreal, New York, and 25 per cent. less than Quebec, and that the lake vessel will be self-paid, by the difference of the ocean freight and the return freight, to continue her voyage to Sydney.
