Callac, Melbourne and San Francisco import English coal from twelve to fourteen thousand miles, while Australia has some of the finest coal fields in the world, and there are coal mines along the Pacific coast, Kingston imports a third of its gas coal from England, while the American coals are near-freights from Montreal to England last year were 35 shillings a ton, and only 5 shillings from Eng land to Montreal. St. John, N.B., imports English cosl twenty nine hundred miles, while the Spring Hill coal is within 150 miles by rail, and Jaggins coal one hundred miles by water. He is negotiating for the Atlantic shipment of Michi-In accordance with the Weights and Messures gan deals, Canadian oil and Western cereals at Sydney, which, he holds, will give an abundance of cheap coal tonnage up to Ontario ports. He thinks that Outario should help to stimulate the inter-Provincial trade by a duty of fifty cents, which will be sufficient, and tend to make the St. Lawrence the highway for the Atlantic shipment of Western cereals. He shows how the Atlantic freights from Sydney are thirty per cent, less than from Montreal New York, and 25 per cent. less than Quebec, and that the lake vessel will be well paid, by the difference of the ocean freight and the return freight, 9 to continue her voyage to Sydney.
