



Mr. Snider, M.P. for North Grey, and seconded by Mr. Metcalfe, M.P. for East York, was ordered by the House of Commons of all sums received as costs or fees by the Minister of Justice or any officer of his Department in connection with claims on the occupiers of Ordnance lands. The return was never brought down, and the reason for withholding it was only too apparent. The present Minister of Justice has, however, supplied the omission of his predecessor, and the revelation is a most unsavoury one.
