Tilden and Tweed's Disclosures.

New York, April 21.-The Committee proceeded to the jail to examine Tweed. John B. Townsend, on behalf of his client, said he advised Tweed to decline the examination upon the ground that answers might criminate him. It was asserted by Woodin before the Senate that Tweed had testified before the Senate that he never directly or indirectly paid or offered to pay money to any menibers of Legislature to secure the passage of any law. If this be'so, and I have no reason to doubt the correctness of Woodin's investigation, I feel impressed with propriety of such advice at this time. Eweed said, however, he disavowed all responsibility for the article in the World; some persons mentioned in the World artiele he did not know. He declined to answer questions concerning Hastings, Barbour, Woodin and others, but admitted that a pool was organized in New York to pass the charter.
