The rule is bad enough, but even when a vessel has the votes in her favor it does not follow that the owner escapes the grasp of this combination, which, apparently, is allowed to carry matters with a pretty high hand. Regarding my experience, a vessel of which I am manager loaded a cargo of grain at Montreal last autumn. In this instance the elevator combination had the votes, and the highest rates had to be paid for loading the grain; but ger, a few weeks later on, arrived at Montrea! - both having been chartered on this side. In October last the grain was brought alongside the ship, and the master arranged with the owner or agent of the interior vessel to vote in favor of taking an elevator at half the combination rate.
