

States. In speaking in high terms of

It is certainly true that in case Canada was attacked we should expect England to protect us with all her might, and we know we should not have to expect in vain. But it is not true that Eugland defrays the expenses of our Government and of our defences. We pay every dollar incurred in the governing of Canada, from the Governor-General's salary of \$50,000 per annum to the smallest items of outlay found in the the maintenance of a volunteer force of considerable magnitude, but we provide a regular body of mounted police for duty in the Northwest, and we garrison Quebec, Kingston and other points with regular troops. With the exception of a regiment at Halifax, the Home Government does not maintain a soldier in Canada, nor does it in any way contribute to the expense of any of our Governments. As or protecting ourselves, we have shown our cousins that we can do that. There s no lack of military ardor in this conntry; we have already raised one regiment for foreign service, which proves that though we expect England to defend us, or help us do it, we are willing and able to help her defend her own interests.
