> Pretoria, Sept. 10.-Ten burghers, charged with violation of their oath of neutrality were tried by court-mas tial here to-day. The evidence showed that they fed and lodged Boer spies and trafficked with commandoes. It was brought out that the Netherlands relief committee paid Sohaap, a spy, who is now a witness for the prosecution, £10 on the recommendation of stated that he went to the consul and asked him to provide for his wife and children, while he was with his commando and the consul replied that he must warn him against rejoining his commando but said that once the witness was out in the field he would assist his wife and family. The Netherlands consul testified that he had no knowledge of Schaap's intention to rejoin his commando. His testimony was much shaken on being crossexamined. About twenty more arrests will be made.

Regarding th settlement of the war question says he notes the degree of suspicion the attitude of the authorities, which he declares is not unnatural but solicitous for the interests of the refugees. He deprecates excessive criti BROS. cism of the military forces whose difficulties are unintelligible to those who have no knowledge. The complete de lusion and unhappy condition of the refugees he contends are maintained their desire to conciliate rather than to fight. The idea that the authorities are conciliating the Boers at the expense of the refugees is, he says contrary to common sense.


