The Practice in Regard to Granting Them.

Sir John Bourinot, the well-known authority on parliamentary and constitutional subjects, was, says the Montreal Herald, asked; in view of the continued discussion with respect to the honors granted in connection with the royal visit, for a statement as to the practice in regard to the creating

He stated that honors were granted on the recommendation of the governor-general, who is the avenue of communication between the colonial office and Canada.

The government had nothing to do with honors and there was no ministerial responsibility in that connec-

limited there being only about 190 in the empire. The C.M.G. granted to several may ors by the duke of York, is also high honor and even it is seldom granted on purely honorary occasions it. too, being an order of merit.

When the king, then the prince of Wales, visited Canada, no bonors were granted to mayors and only two knighthoods given, these being to the speakers of the legislative council and

These honors were granted because legislative bodies adopted ad dresses to the prince which the speakers presented. Parliament presented no addresses to the duke of York, so there was no opportunity or occasion for conferring honors on the speakers. There is a marked distinction be-

tween the ordinary knighthood and the K.C. In the latter everything connected with the honor is given gratis because the honor is given in recognition of merit. This is not the case with the former.
