There was no coercion-the alliance is simply trying to secure the liberty of the laboring classes, and also to prevent the Sabbath day from being wiped out of existence. The alliance endeavoring to protect man in his right to rest one day in seven.

Mr. Shearer warned the workingmen that their rest day was seriously endangered by the greed of corporations and employers, and by selfish seekers of pleasure. The preservation of the Sabbath day is simply one way of shortening the hours of labor. Every inroad on the integrity of the Lord's day means robbery of the workman's right. To work on Sabbath really means that men toil In Ottawa, Toronto, and in other places the labor unions were doing so, and he was glad to know that in Kingston also this was being done. Mr. Shearer referred to the Ontario Lord's day law, which, he said, was iniquitous in its distinctions. How is it, he asked, that corporations are not punished, when workmen, merchants and others are? Why is it
