Municipal Ownership.

The municipal undertakings in England have doubled in number in less than two years. Liverpool has reduced the electricity fifty per cent., paid all charges and maintenance, and made a profit of \$50,000 for the city and treasury. In Leeds the town reduced rates and made a profit of \$40,000 studies, lack of time and four hours a day from their work-000 a year for the city. A similar cars, but operates only twenty-four of these, the others being leased out. On the city operated lines the rates have been reduced, have an all-night service, the employees work three hours less than on other lines, and made a profit of \$250,000 the first year. 
