

In reply he simply grinned, and, after a repetition of the query, declined to afford any information. The workers being more communicative, it appeared that they were toiling gratuitously for their landlord, who required this service at their hands, and not this only, but many another of a like kind in the course of the year. Whole families and all their cathe soil may get his work cheaply and expeditionsly done. In this particular case the poor people were supplied with a dinner, but on an adjoining estate not even a crust of bread is given, while a wholesale system of fines for neglect in performing the labor required of them adds insuit to injury.
