The greater bulk of them have come from Michigan and surrounding states. The crop in Germany was a partial failure this year, while in Michigan it was especially abundant owing to the fact that the truck gardeners turned their attention to cabbage instead of beets. The cabbages bring the gardeners only \$3 a ton, loaded on cars.


