

Half a Million in India; China Has Letter From Sergt. McCulla. Sergt. McCulla, with "C" battery.

R.C.F.A., writes from Sayhand, on Sept. "C" battery retired on Scot. 9th from Warmbath, as the place was unhealthy, forty-six of the men having been sent to Pretoria on the previous day, suffering from fever. The column then moved south-east to Saultman to intercept a party of Free Staters with rattle. The battery failed to catch them. At Hebron, twenty miles northwest of Pretoria, the battery joined Col. Hickman's force which had moved out and captured the Free Staters' cattle. Gen. Paget joined the batteries, and the combined force moved to Boode Koppa to storm a Boer laager. The advance was unopposed, only one trooper being killed. The Boer women and children were turned out of their homes which were burned, as also were the crops. Some Borr prisoners were taker-

On Sept. 18th the force returned to Hebron, and then to Waterval where halt was made. There several of the men contracted fever on account of bud water. On the 21st the force under Col. Planner captured the entire camp of trasmus, a How communder. Nearly themselves. The women and children were sent to Pretoria.
