



In Spite of Elections Parliament Will Open in January, Ottawa, Nov. 26.-The government has

decided, after discussing the matter fully, to have an early session of parliament. Generally parliament has been summoned about the middle of Februlater. It has been the exception, and there were as a rule special reasons for it, if parliament met earlier. Only on six occasions since confederation has the session been called for l January. The last occasion when it met in January was by reason of the remedial bill, when Sir Mackenzie ell and his cubinet decided to coerce the province of Manitoba.

The date of the approaching session will be fixed for the latter part of January or not later than the beginning of February. Last session parliament met on February 1st, and the year previous on February 3rd. Owing to the time taken up with the general elections it was not expected that the government would have been ready nect parliament so soon, but they are for a winter session, so that the members may be able to get through with their work before the warm weather ar-

There is not likely to be a long bill of fare from the government, and therefore there can be no good reason prorogation could not be reached early in May. A good many of the long speech-makers were defeated, and alone ought to shorten the session
