Preserving Wood.

A curious byproduct of zinc is chloride or salts of zinc, which formerly went to waste, but now is used as a wood preservative by railroads, bridge builders and dock builders, and for the protection of shingles, clapboards, pillars and any other wood that is exposed to moisture or influences that cause decay. The salts of zinc, in solution, by hydraulic pressure are forced into the pores of the wood, which is then soaked in a strong solution of tannin and glue. The ties and piling Pacific and other western roads are treated in this manner. The railway companies named use from 3,000,000 to 4,000,000 pounds a year each. With this treatment a pine tie, which is the only kind that can be found out in the mountain country. will last three times as long as one of oak. -Chicago Record.
