

successful administration of business has been practiced. Our mission account has exceeded the estimates by about \$600, but on the other hand we have saved that amount on other items of expenditure, especially expenses of high standing committee and office and travelling expenses. The amounts spent on mission work were found to be absolutely necessary.

"As our financial position will now allow of it, I would suggest that steps be taken for the purpose of paying at least part of the expenses of delegates to the next high court. Your finance committee of last year estimated an income, including cash on hand, of \$6,653 81, which has been more than realized, as the actual amount received has been \$6,934 33 The estimated expenditure for the year was \$6,965 57, which included \$2,785 57 to be paid to clear off total debt to supreme court, thereby showing a deficit of \$311.76. To avoid this we have paid \$2,000 on account to supreme court, leaving a balance jue on old account of \$785 57, which with the amount due for supplies for the past year, \$510.06; and salaries unpaid, \$225, on 30th June last make a total indebted. ness \$1,520 63.
