It is a trite saying and a true one that murder will out. The old adage had another exemplification last evening when police constable Aiken placed under arrest Nestle Sly, a pretty little lass of nineteen summers, charged with the death of her newly born infant.

Police constable Aiken was detailed on the case and the public may judge of his keenness when last night he tracked the girl to her hiding place at Washburn, whence she went on Thursday. She was brought back at noon to-day in company with the police constable.

On Thursday she went down to Washburn to visit her uncle and aunt, whom she visited regularly. On Sunday night last at about ten o'clock her infant was born. The mother was alone and unattended. In consequence of being unable to give the child the proper care nature required, the poor infant did not survive the shock, and died in a few minutes.

Next morning the mother arose, wrapped the body in a napkin and then in paper and hid it in her room. She then went about her usual work, but not before she had removed all articles likely to betray her. She performed her day's work and at night took the parcel containing the body of her baby and hid it in the house. Why she sent it to Dr. Bell she does not know, unless it was because she knew he was connected with the infant's home and knew what to do with it.
