Mrs. Soles' Statement. KINGSTON, Ont., Sept. 29.—(To the Editor): As there are many conflicting rumors current regarding the cause of ill. ness and death of our beloved child, May Irene Soles, I desire to make the following explanation :

My child was taken ill Friday, Septem. and gall ducts. There was no sign of sore throat whatever until Monday, Soptember 255h (although examined daily) when a white spot about the size of a pea appeared on one tonsil. This was removed and ex. amined with a microscope, but although no diphtherible germa were diecovered the attending physician. thinking is looked suspicious, began treatment at 8 a. m. Monday for diphtheria. In all four bottles of antitox. ine were used throughout the day, and every other means known employed to stay the disease. The throat gradually improv. ed but the liver became worse and swelled to an enormous size, the body at the same time becoming severely jaundiced.

The case was reported to Dr. Fee on Monday, the day the disease occurred, and no eff it at concealment was even thought of. No one was allowed to eater or leave the house except those employed therein and in accual attendance on the child (ave one woman who entered without permission, bub was immediately informed) After death those in attendance were made to take an antiseptic bath and change their clothes throughout (leaving the Shees.
